

Chaplain's Corner

Dear Brother Knights and Ladies,

The Pew Research Center, a non-political research organization, reported a growing number of conservative American Catholics are critical of Pope Francis. They point to Francis' criticisms of capitalism, advocacy for climate change, overtures to the LGBTQ community, and moves to permit civilly remarried Catholics in some cases to receive the Eucharist without an annulment. Some thoughts...

Francis is not against capitalism *per se* but a capitalism that puts money over people. We see this right here in Tampa-St. Pete where rents are being raised excessively, so individuals and families have to move elsewhere and often cannot find "affordable housing." To make a few extra bucks individuals in lower income brackets are forced to move or may even end up homeless.

Social sciences have documented that LGBTQ individuals do not choose their sexual orientation. They discover their sexual orientation. It is the way God made them. Any number of our fellow Knights have brothers and sisters, sons or daughters, and friends who are gay. They can tell you that basically they are good Catholics like us. Yes, there are places in the Bible that condemn homosexuality - mainly in the Hebrew Scriptures and New Testament - where the cultural-historical context of the times considered all gays and lesbians perverts. Today we know that is not true. Pope Francis does not want to push LGBTQ people out of their rightful place in the Community of Faith as sons and daughters of the living God.

Pope Francis has written two important encyclicals of carrying for creation. When many of us were growing up, the earth was the earth. Now we realize the Earth belongs to God who shares it with us and asks us to be stewards for our homeland for ourselves, our children, our future - or we will not have one!

Through no fault of their own a number of good Catholic marriages end up in divorce - perhaps a bad choice of a partner for any number of reasons or maybe the spouse was unfaithful or abusive. A Catholic may not have known how to get an annulment and finds themselves outcasts in the practice of their faith. Should Communion - so vital to our faith - be used as reward-punishment instead of the blessing and nurture of our friendship with Jesus and with the Community? As a pastor, Pope Francis wants our Church to be as welcoming and hospitable as possible and not push people away. I am totally supportive of marriage for life, but in the real world of human beings it does not always work that way. How many Catholics do you know who no longer practice because of divorce? Even among our brother Knights, there are more second marriages than you think.



Saint for the Month of May

The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, Memorial – May 20, 2024

"Behold, your Mother." In entrusting his Mother Mary to the beloved disciple from the cross, our Lord is concerned for much more than her practical living arrangements: He establishes a relationship between his holy Mother and all who are united to him, that is, the church. We, too, behold our Mother, for she is the Mother of all who live the new life of grace. We turn to her especially when we experience the cross, knowing she is "standing by." Today's memorial teaches us that "growth in the Christian life must be anchored to the mystery of the cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic banquet, and to the Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the redeemed, the Virgin who makes her offering to God" (Robert Cardinal Sarah). A beautiful way to honor our Mother is to pray the rosary frequently.


<u>Vote NO to #4</u>: this is the mantra going forward, for all people of goodwill, through the General Election Day on Nov 5, 2024. Why? Because the FL Supreme Court, on a 4-3 decision, has allowed onto the ballot this amendment to our state constitution that would enshrine abortion up to birth.

The FL Conference of Catholic Bishops oppose this extreme abortion amendment that legalizes full-term abortion with no protections for the preborn child. This proposed amendment would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Even the terms 'viability' and 'healthcare provider' are nebulous and not defined, allowing for more ambiguity and confusion. The amendment would effectively overturn our common-sense laws that have regulated abortion for years, including eliminating parental consent for minors, eliminating informed consent requirements for pregnant women, eliminating the requirement to have medical doctors perform abortions, eliminating basic and health and safety requirements for abortion clinics, and eliminating restrictions on public funding of abortions. Read that last sentence over and over again and think about each one of those safeguards that will be eliminated. These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment. That's why we say: Vote NO to #4!

The FL bishops urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion, to oppose the abortion amendment, and to Vote NO to #4. In doing so, we will protect the weakest, most innocent and defenseless of human life, and the countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion. Human life is sacred. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.



Standdown!

On April 6 JJ Coyne, Bill Gallant and Jerry Custin set up a table loaded with various items we thought would be useful to our homeless veteran's community attending an annual Standdown organized and hosted by the Bay Pines Regional Veterans Hospital. This included \$2,300 worth of laundry pods, hand sanitizer sunscreen, new t-shirts and underwear, socks, toothbrushes and toothpaste and, to clean it all up, toilet paper. Turns out that more than 430 veterans attended the event along with fifty or more organizations providing a variety of services. To say our work was appreciated is an understatement as we exhausted our stock within a couple hours and had numerous excellent conversation snippets with the vets using our services.

One in particular stood out. The vet asked, "What is the Knights of Columbus?" We explained that we are a group of Catholic men formed around the four core principles which led us to the Standdown: Unity, Charity, Fraternity and Patriotism. By serving vets we fulfilled all four of those principles. We asked if he was Catholic. He said that he was raised Baptist but was recently released from thirteen years in prison about a year ago and was working to get his life together including the spiritual component. He shared that he appreciated not only our "stuff" but the fact we were sharing our mission with him and the vets. A nice moment.

I'll close with a poem that was written and recited wonderfully by a local veteran, John Whitehead Sr. This was done at the event opening and perfectly captures the intent of the day. It's called Start Over.

The Great Restoration

By his death and resurrection, in the power of the Holy Spirit, the Lord seeks to heal and recreate us, body and soul

As an antique car enthusiast, I subscribe to a magazine that features photos of cars from bygone eras. I enjoy seeing cars that were new when I was young ('50s-'70s), but to my eye, nothing quite compares to a Packard from the 1930s. That combination of towering engine grille and graceful pontoon fenders is a thing of real beauty. Their interiors were well-appointed and spacious, the engine and transmission quiet and smooth. And some of these cars look like they just rolled off the showroom floor.

But not all of them. Many old cars languish in fields and barns. Others fare better; they've been acquired by new owners willing to go through the arduous process of restoring them. That process contradicts the adage that beauty is only skin deep. To restore an old car, one typically has to rebuild the engine and transmission, as well as repair the frame, suspension, and electrical system. The most thorough restorations involve taking the car's body off the frame and rebuilding it from the ground up.

All this might be more than you wanted to know about restoring antique cars, but it's actually leading somewhere. We just celebrated Easter, the feast of the Resurrection, the heart of the liturgical year. For 50 days, the Church extends the celebration of this great and wondrous mystery: The rising of Christ opens the way for the thorough restoration of our humanity.

Indeed, that is why Christ came into the world - to restore our wounded human dignity, damaged by sin and spiritual neglect, to undo the effects of original sin, to make us shine with the glory he shares eternally with his Father in the Holy Spirit. Divine restoration neglects no part of us. The Lord is out to re-create us, body and soul.

A really thorough restoration is always from the inside out. After all, what good is it to restore the body of an antique car if the engine won't start or the transmission's gears are slipping? What kind of restoration contents itself with a shabby interior? Just so, the Lord seeks to restore us in the deepest truth of our existence - in the depth of our being, from the inside out. The Gospel says that Jesus knew human nature well (Jn 2:25), and small wonder: It was through him we were made, and it was our nature that he assumed (Jn 1:3,14). So, like an expert restorer, Jesus knows the repairs that need to be made, not merely in how we appear to others, but in how we really are, in the core of our being. The Lord, in the power of the Spirit, is out to cleanse our consciences from sin, to purify and enlarge our hearts, to empower us to advance in holiness.

That is why, when the risen Lord appeared to the Apostles in the upper room, he gave them power to forgive sins, a power that reaches us in the sacrament of reconciliation. That is also why, on the Second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate the Divine Mercy by which God forgives and restores us, his handiwork. He makes us shine outwardly with the beauty of inward truth, integrity and love.

God's restorative work extends throughout our lives and indeed beyond this earthly life. Just as an old car is most thoroughly restored when its body is removed from its frame, this is what happens when we die. Our body and soul are separated until the resurrection of the dead. Purgatory provides further restoration of the soul before it beholds the glory of God. At the end of time, body and soul will be reunited, but the result will be far more than a resuscitated corpse. No, we shall be made new. As St. John says, "Beloved, we are God's children now. What we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is" (1 Jn 3:2).

Pray For Those Who Persecute You

With Easter season, we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and our renewed hope for sharing eternal life with God in Heaven. It is amazing enough that God's Love is so great that he created us in his image and likeness, and that he took on our humanity, suffering humiliation and death on the Cross for our redemption from sin. But through the Resurrection, he has also shown us that "death does not have the final word", and that we are called to share in the divine life, body and soul, to be with Him in all eternity. Just contemplating this reality should overwhelm us with awe and humility.

This view of human life is a fundamental part of our Catholic beliefs and underlies the Order's service to the most vulnerable in our society— people with special needs, those that lack the basic necessities of life, women needing assistance to care for young children. But the right to human life itself, particularly for the unborn, is especially important. As the Florida Bishops have put it, ". . . the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state."

A proposed amendment to the Florida Constitution, which will appear on the ballot on November 5, 2024, will effectively permit abortion in Florida in nearly all circumstances. Our Bishops have already issued an eloquent statement in opposition to this amendment, and I certainly cannot improve upon that statement. But the question is—what should we as Knights do?

First, pray. If you already pray, pray more! Our Bishops have already composed a prayer for this specific issue, and I encourage all Councils to make use of this prayer.

Second, support our Bishops and, by extension, all our parishes and our clergy as they work to educate and communicate the position of the Church here in Florida on this proposed amendment and on abortion. Let's work with them and remember that the laity, in particular, are called to the mission of evangelization in the secular world that we inhabit.

Third, encourage all Knights—and all Catholics—to register to vote, and to vote "No" to this proposed amendment in November.

As we go about this mission, we are bound to encounter those who support this amendment and oppose our position and perhaps oppose the Church more broadly. We must remember that they too are created in the image and likeness of God, and that God calls them to divine life. And so even those that oppose us with every fiber of their being deserve to be treated with dignity, charity, and patience. The best guide to this is the words of Jesus Himself:


"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy'. But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:43-45)

One final admonition: in supporting an issue of such grave importance, it is tempting to bring partisan politics into the fray. Councils and members must remember the strict prohibition of engaging in partisan politics as Knights. As individuals, members are free to exercise their rights and participate in partisan political speech and activity. But when doing so, do not wear the emblem of the Order in any way (such as Council polo shirts or even lapel pins), and do not represent yourself as a Knight.

Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.


In our daily life and work, May we reflect the self-giving love which you, O Father, eternally show with your Son and the Holy Spirit.
